### ABOUT THE SPEAKER



**Eric Saul**, Founder and Executive Director of Visas for Life and Institute for the Study of Rescue and Altruism in the Holocaust (ISRAH), a nonprofit corporation. Saul received an Associate of Arts degree from Los Angeles Valley College and completed two years with a major in history at San Francisco State University (SFSU).

Saul served as founding curator of the Military Museum at the Presidio of San Francisco from 1973-1986. For a span of over 30 years, his 100th/442nd/MIS exhibits have been displayed at numerous venues including the Smithsonian Institution in Washington DC, the Ellis Island Immigration Museum in New York and the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles.

Eric Saul is presently writing a major new book on diplomatic rescue in World War II.
