The Superlative Artistry of Japan is a traveling exhibition that presents an extensive collection of works and materials from various genres that each place great emphasis on advanced techniques, ingenious artistic expressions, and a high level of perfection that takes viewers by surprise.

This two-part exhibition showcases elaborate Meiji era (1868 - 1912) kōgei-hin (o 芸品, handicrafts) works that played a significant role in initiating the Japonism trend in 19th century Europe. Numerous contemporary art pieces of superlative artistry such as textiles, capsule toy figures, and food samples are also featured—all of which illustrate a strong commitment to Japanese craftsmanship.
