This summer two exhibitions return to the **JICC, Embassy of Japan** highlighting the artistry of Japanese Kites and artifacts from baseball history.

Art in the Wind: Step back into past JICC exhibitions from 2017 & 2018 at our seasonal pop-up! Explore Japan's centuries-old kite tradition with 50+ traditional kites, and uncover unique baseball history and artifacts from Japan's national sport.

A New League: From the collection of baseball historian **Adam Berenbak** comes an exhibition to celebrate the bonds between the U.S. and Japan forged through the game of baseball. Featuring baseball related historical objects and artifacts from Japan, the exhibition will trace the history of the sport in Japan, from its introduction and rapid transformation into Japan's national sport, as well as explore the fascinating history of sports exchange and "baseball diplomacy" between Japan and the U.S. – avenues of contact that have fostered friendship, goodwill, and reconciliation between the two nations.



This seasonal retrospective is **free and open to the public**. This display will run from July 22 through August 23.
