Although the direct translation of *chanoyu* (茶の湯) is actually "hot water for tea," Omotesenke refers to chanoyu as Japanese tea ceremony.

Tea ceremonies are centered around the communication between hosts and their guests through tea, decor, and deliberate movements and manners in a harmonious setting. These gatherings provide a space for reflection and respite from the demands of everyday life.

In this exhibition, we invite you to embark on an imaginary journey to a small tea gathering held in a traditional tearoom for a much-needed escape from the distractions of daily life. Come discover the tranquil beauty and mindfulness of this centuries-long practice.
